The State of Nebraska, } Comes now William T. Haney, your petitioner, and shows the Court:
Hooker County. } That one Ellen Gibson died intestate on or about the 23rd day of January, 1913, being at the date of her death a resident and an inhabitant of Hooker county, Nebraska. That more than two years have elapsed since the death of said deceased and that there are no debts against said estate of any nature or kind. That said deceased at the time of her death was seized of an interest in real estate in the State of Nebraska, as follows: a fee simple interest in and to the SW¹/₄SE¹/₄, S²/₂SW¹/₄, section 32, Township 21, the NE¹/₄, E²/₂NW¹/₄, NE¹/₄SW¹/₄, NW¹/₄SE¹/₄, of section 6, in Township 20 North of Range 33 West of the 6th P.M., also a fee simple interest in and to the South 57¹/₂ feet of lots 7 and 8 in block 13, in the original town of Mullen, Hooker county, Nebraska. That said lands and every part thereof are wholly exempt from the payment of debts and wholly exempt from execution, attachment or other mesne process and not liable for the payment of debts of said deceased. That your petitioner is a son-in-law of the said deceased and that at the date of the death of said deceased the said Ellen Gibson was a widow and that the sole and only heirs left by deceased consisted of sons and daughters all being over the age of 21 years of age and that the names residences and ages of said heirs at law are as follows:

William Gibson, aged 49 years, postoffice address, Mullen, Nebraska, a son.

Your petitioner would therefore pray that an order issue setting a date for a hearing on this petition and that same be published as required by law and that upon said hearing the regular administration of said estate be dispensed with and an order issue as to the succession of the lands herein set out and owned by said deceased at the date of her death and for such other and further relief as may be just and equitable.

DECREE DISPENSING WITH REGULAR ADMINISTRATION.

In The Matter of The Estate of } In The County Court of Hooker County, Nebraska.
Ellen Gibson, Deceased. } Now, on this 10" day of August, 1920, this cause came on to be heard on the petition of William T. Haney, for the dispensation of the regular administration of the estate of Ellen Gibson, deceased, and the evidence, and was duly submitted to the Court. On consideration whereof the Court finds that due and legal notice of the pendency of said petition has been duly given by the publication of an order heretofore entered, for three successive weeks in the Hooker County Tribune, a weekly newspaper published and of general circulation in Hooker county, Nebraska, according to law. The Court further finds that the said Ellen Gibson deceased, died intestate on or about the 23" day of January, 1913, and that at the date of her death was a resident and an inhabitant of Hooker county, Nebraska, and leaving an estate of inheritance in the State of Nebraska, consisting of real property described as follows, to wit:
SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, S $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of section 32, in Township 21 N.R. 33, in Hooker county, Nebraska, and NE $\frac{1}{4}$, E $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, of section 6, in T. 20 N.R. 33 "C" P.M., in McPherson county, Nebraska, and the South 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet of lots 7-8, in block 13, in the original town of Mullen, in Hooker county, Nebraska.

That more than two years have elapsed since the death of said deceased, and that no application has been made in the State of Nebraska, for the administration of said estate, and that said lands are wholly exempt from execution, attachment or other mesne process and not liable for the payment of the debts of deceased. The Court further finds that the deceased at the time of her death was a widow, and that she left surviving her no husband, and that the only heirs at law of deceased consisted of daughters and one son, whose names and places of residence are as follows:

William Gibson, son, residence, Cherry county, Nebraska, all of which heirs at law are over the age of twenty one years of age, at the date of the death of said deceased. That under the law of succession of real property, the lands herein described passed at the date of the death of the said Ellen Gibson to her heirs at law, to wit, Anna LeLacheur, Margaret J. Hazelbaker, Agnes Thompson, Mary E. Neal, Sarah Haney, Ella Bower and William Gibson, share and share alike.

It is therefore considered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that the regular administration of the estate of Ellen Gibson, deceased, be, and the same is hereby dispensed with, and that the title to the real property herein described, of which the said Ellen Gibson died seized, passed at the date of the death of said deceased to Anna LeLacheur, Margaret J. Hazelbaker, Agnes Thompson, Mary E. Neal, Sarah Haney, Ellen Bower and William Gibson, to each an undivided one-seventh interest.
